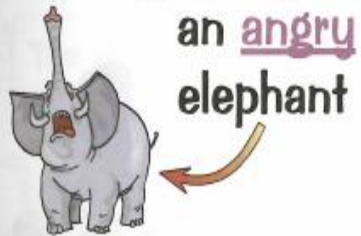

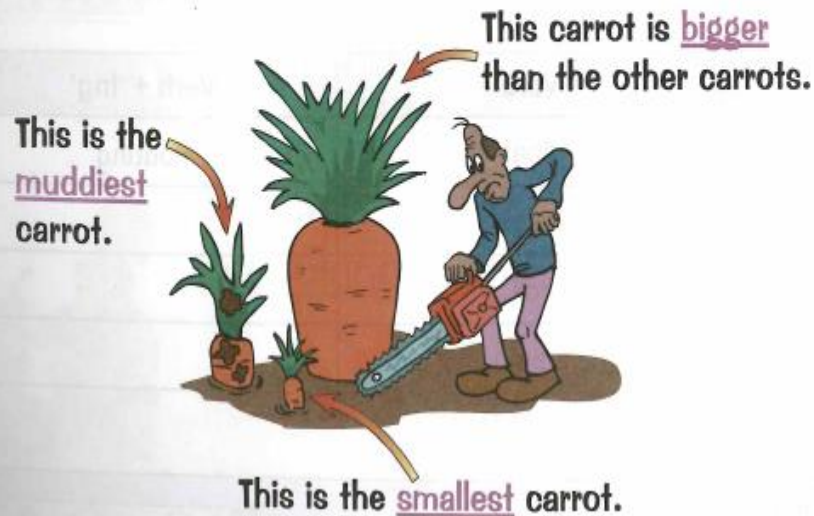

Adverbs describe verbs

Adverbs tell you how the action was done.



The ship sailed smoothly.



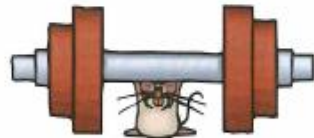
It rained lightly.

Adverbs often end in 'ly'

Lots of adverbs are made by adding 'ly' to the end of an adjective.

strong → strongly

calm → calmly



If the word already ends in 'y',
change the 'y' to an 'i', then add 'ly'.

messy → messily

funny → funnily

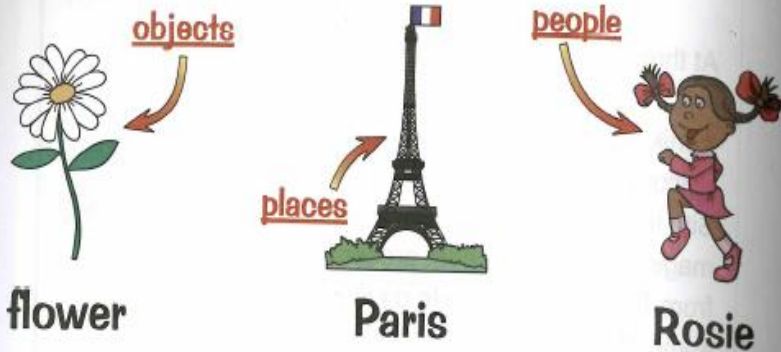

Nouns and Noun Phrases

Nouns are words that **name things**



Noun phrases have nouns and **other words**

You can add **words** to a noun to **describe** it or to **point out** which noun you're talking about. This is called a **noun phrase**.



the **fat** cat

The writer is **describing** the cat.



this chair

The writer is **pointing out** which chair they're talking about.
