


<p>Writing</p> <p>It is important that the children keep practising their writing. Here are a few ideas to get them going:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ☺ Choose your favourite toy and pretend they go on an adventure to a magical place. What might happen there? ☺ Write a letter for your family or friends and read it to 	

them over the phone.

- ☺ Describe what you can see out of your bedroom window.
- ☺ Write an acrostics poem where each line starts with the next letter in your name.
- ☺ Choose your favourite animal and find out about them on the internet. Write a report about where they live, what they eat and their appearance. Can you include an interesting fact and a question?

Remember to include:

- Expanded noun phrases to describe something
- Correct spelling and punctuation
- Different conjunctions such as but, when, if, because
- Headings in your report
- Funny moments or your opinion to engage the reader.

Spellings we would like you to practise:

Their – *The children put their coats on.*

There – *The cat is over there.*

They're – *What do you think they're going to do next?*

Maths

Everyday counting with children is invaluable. Continue to practise counting in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's.

We have been learning about fractions recently. You could practise finding fractions practically. We have learnt to find $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, and $\frac{1}{3}$ of an amount.

We have learnt equivalent fractions $\frac{1}{2} = \frac{2}{4}$. We have practised finding fractions of shapes.

You could also go on shape hunt. What shapes can you find in your home?

Use the clock to keep you on track with your daily routine. Learn to tell the time and recognise o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past.
