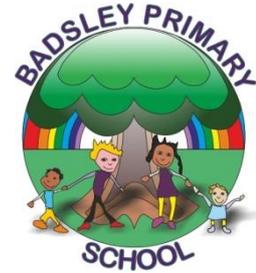

<p>Reading Log onto your Bedrock Learning to do 2 lessons or more each week.</p> <p>Spellings: Learn spellings ending with suffix: -ancy. Find out what they mean and put each one into a sentence – hesitancy, truancy, accountancy, discrepancy, infancy, vacancy, buoyancy, tenancy, compliancy, occupancy</p> <p>Complete the 4 reading comprehensions (see separate PDF document)</p> <p>Make sure you are reading for at least 20 minutes a day to an adult. Make a note of words you have needed to clarify.</p>	
<p>Writing</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Watch ‘The Tiny Crusader’ on youtube (3-4 minutes long), then write the story of what happens next. You could be one of the characters. Remember to check spellings and punctuation and keep the reader interested. 2. Write a letter to your teacher to say what you miss about school? 3. Find a reading book and write down 10 words from it that begin with the same letter eg the letter ‘s’ Then put all 10 words in alphabetical order. Repeat with other letters. 4. Use them to generate 4-digit and 5-digit numbers to</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Put in order from smallest to biggest 2) Order with < and > symbols 3) Practise column addition and subtraction 4) Divide them by 6, 8, 4 or 12 or make your own number up to divide them by 5) Multiply them by 7, 5, 13 or 25 6) Double each number

Find out where the countries are and how many miles the food travelled to get to you.
